

ZOOM PRO ACCOUNT AND TRAINING

The PIRO team will request a Zoom Pro account for you using your UCD email account. You will get an email from the IT team to activate your Pro account. Please make sure to respond to the invite email. You cannot use another Zoom Pro account and must use the GSM account. We have set certain restrictions and settings based on university guidelines.

Some areas to review while planning your course for online instruction are:

- **PLANNING:** this area will go over tips and tricks on how to transition your in-person class to online content and what is most effective for your students.
- **COMMUNICATION:** this area is vital when transitioning to online teaching. How do you want your students to communicate with you during class, during the duration of the course, etc?
- **TEACHING:** What training do you need to teach your course remotely, what equipment is needed, what works best to deliver your course? So many questions, you need to ask yourself and review the options that will best met your needs. The GSM IT Support staff can also provide training to you in Zoom and provide equipment you may need to teach.
- **EXAMS:** The website covers alternatives to testing. It provides valuable ways to assess students remotely. Offers resources to explore alternative testing options.
